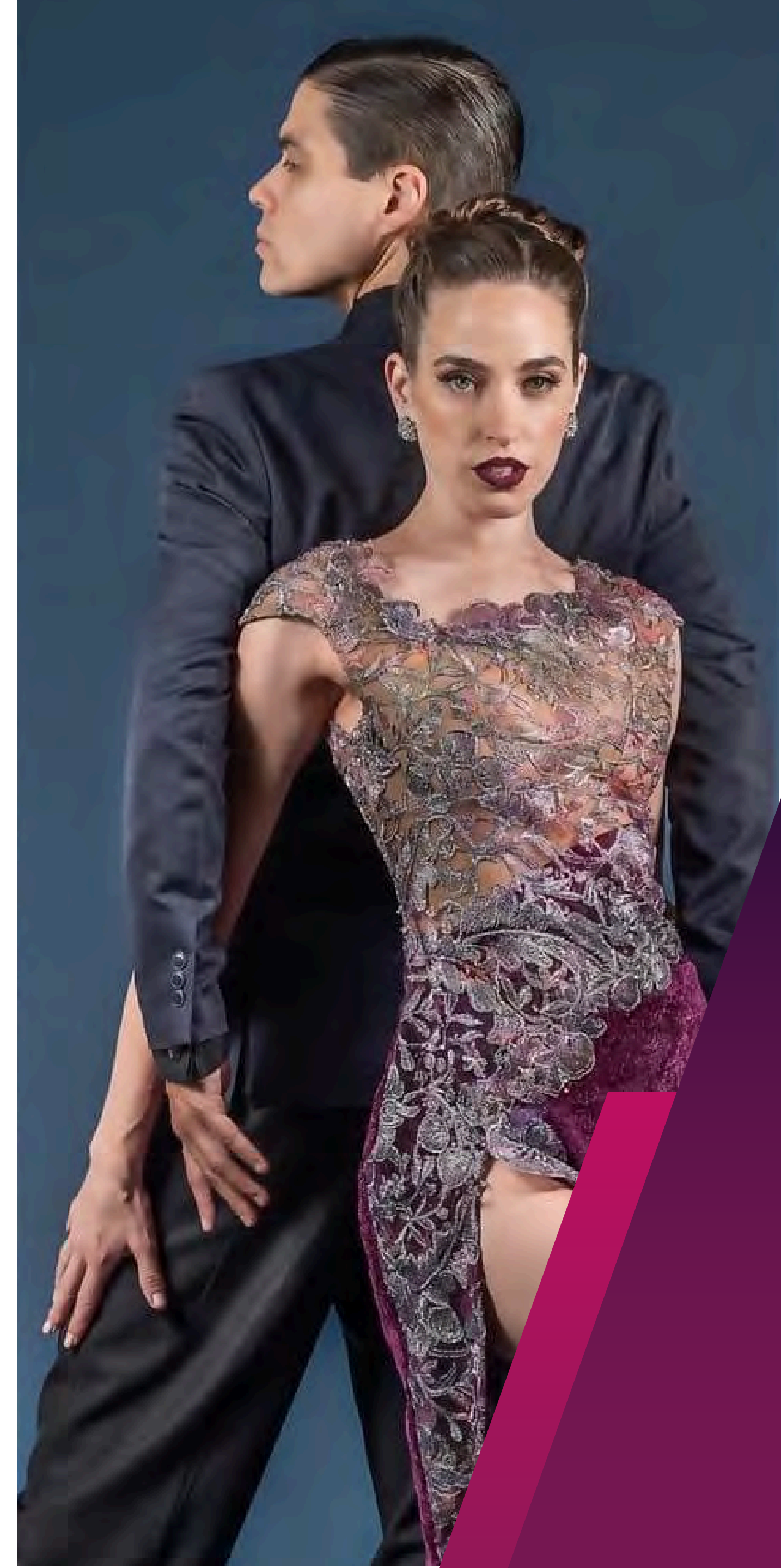

Ideally set in the Giza district of Cairo, Pyramids Palace INN 5 Minutes from the New Grand Museum is located a 18-minute walk from Great Sphinx, 1.6 miles from Giza Pyramids and 8.8 miles from Cairo Tower. The property is around 9.3 miles from Tahrir Square, 9.5 miles from The Egyptian Museum and 10 miles from Mosque of Ibn Tulun.

In case this hotel is already full by the time we make reservations, we will propose another venue in the same category with view on the pyramids.

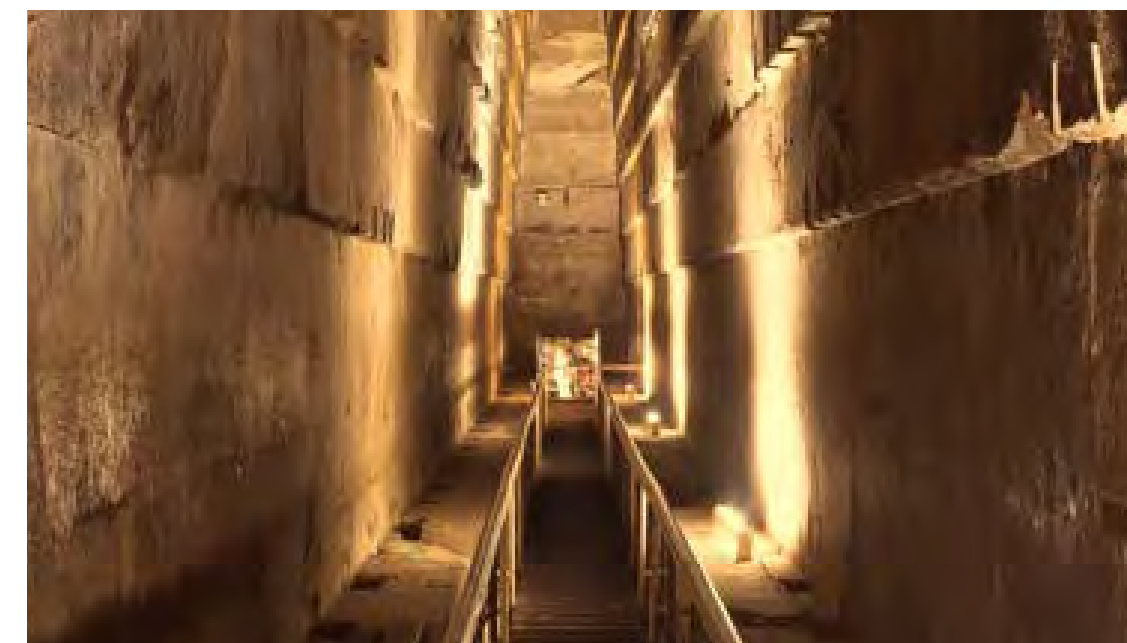


The great pyramid of Giza

The Giza Pyramids and the Sphinx are Egypt's most iconic landmarks, showcasing the grandeur of ancient Egyptian civilization. These timeless monuments, including the Great Pyramid of Khufu, one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World, stand as awe-inspiring testaments to ancient engineering and artistry.

The Great Pyramid of Khufu

The tour inside the Great Pyramid of Khufu offers a rare opportunity to explore the monument from within. Visitors enter through a narrow passage leading to the impressive Grand Gallery and continue to the King's Chamber, home to Khufu's granite sarcophagus. The Sphinx is a majestic limestone statue with the body of a lion and the head of a pharaoh, believed to represent King Khafre. Standing near the Giza Pyramids, it is one of the oldest and largest monolithic statues in the world, symbolizing strength and wisdom.

We'll see it from behind the protected area.

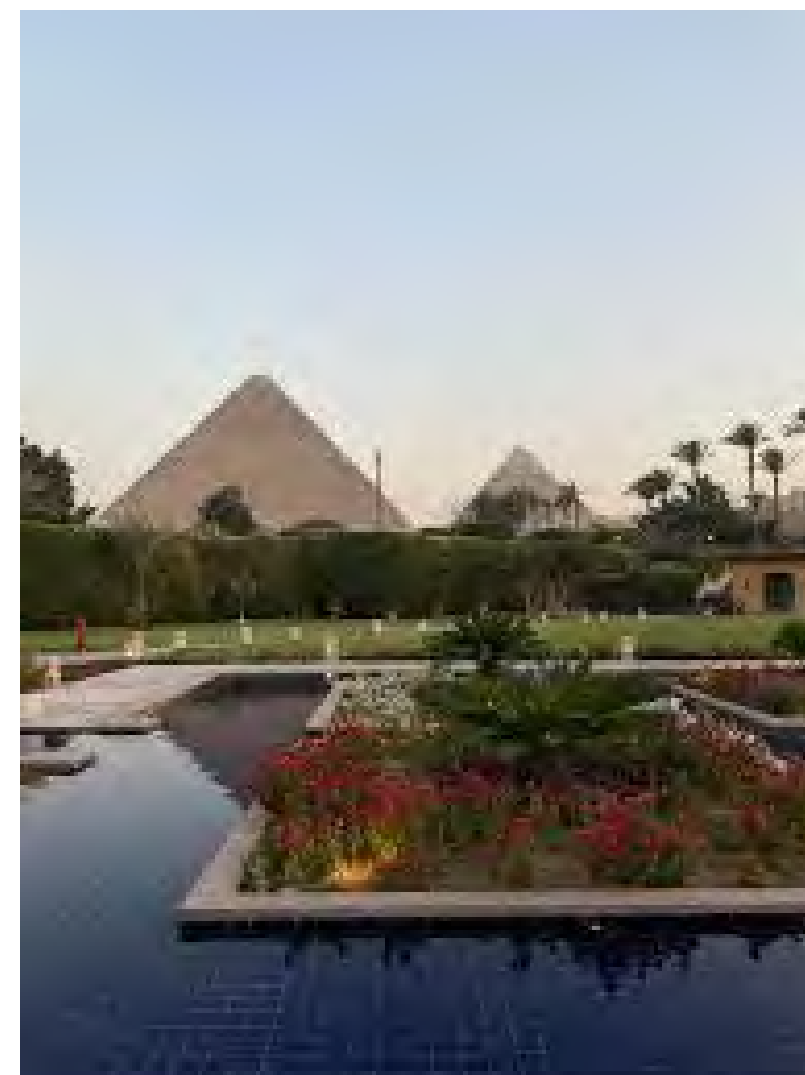


Lunch at 139 Pavillion

The Grand Egyptian Museum

After lunch we'll visit the Grand Egyptian Museum ((GEM).

Officially opened in November 2025, this spectacular, state-of-the-art museum marks a new era in the presentation of Egypt's ancient heritage. Its monumental architecture and innovative design create a powerful setting for an extraordinary collection, including iconic masterpieces and treasures displayed to the public for the very first time.

Walking through its vast galleries, with the Pyramids of Giza visible in the distance, we experience a profound connection between ancient history and the modern world. The Grand Egyptian Museum offers not only knowledge and awe, but a deeply moving encounter with one of the world's greatest civilizations.



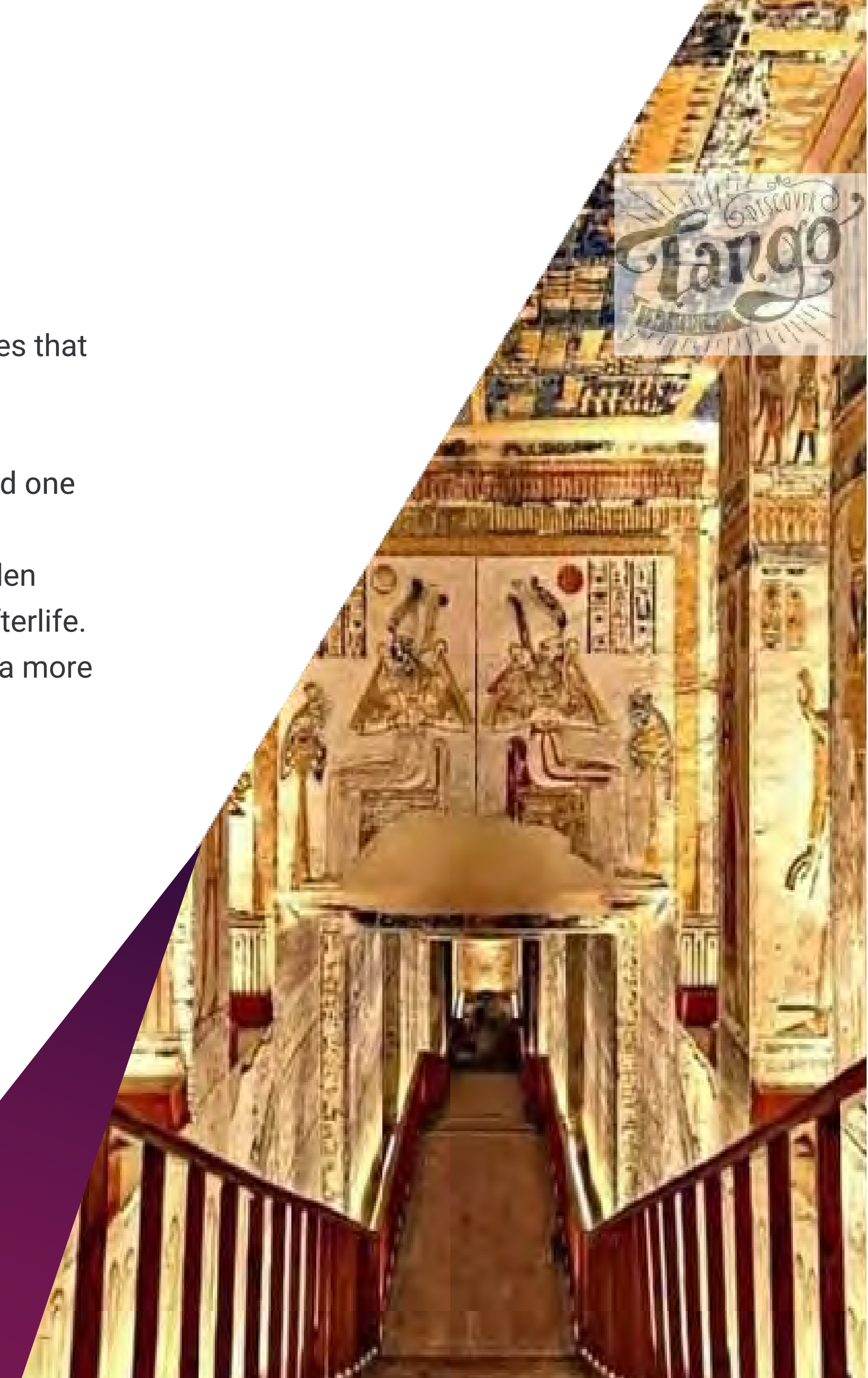
Valley of the Kings

Once we arrive to Luxor with our early-morning flight, we will immediately start visiting the most iconic sites that this region offers.

The Valley of the Kings, located near Luxor, about 60kms from Esna, is a UNESCO World Heritage site and one of the most iconic archaeological locations in the world.

It served as the burial ground for pharaohs and powerful nobles of the New Kingdom, who chose this hidden desert valley to protect their richly decorated tombs filled with symbolism, rituals, and beliefs about the afterlife. During our visit, you will have the opportunity to choose two tombs of your choice to explore, allowing for a more personal and meaningful discovery of this extraordinary site.

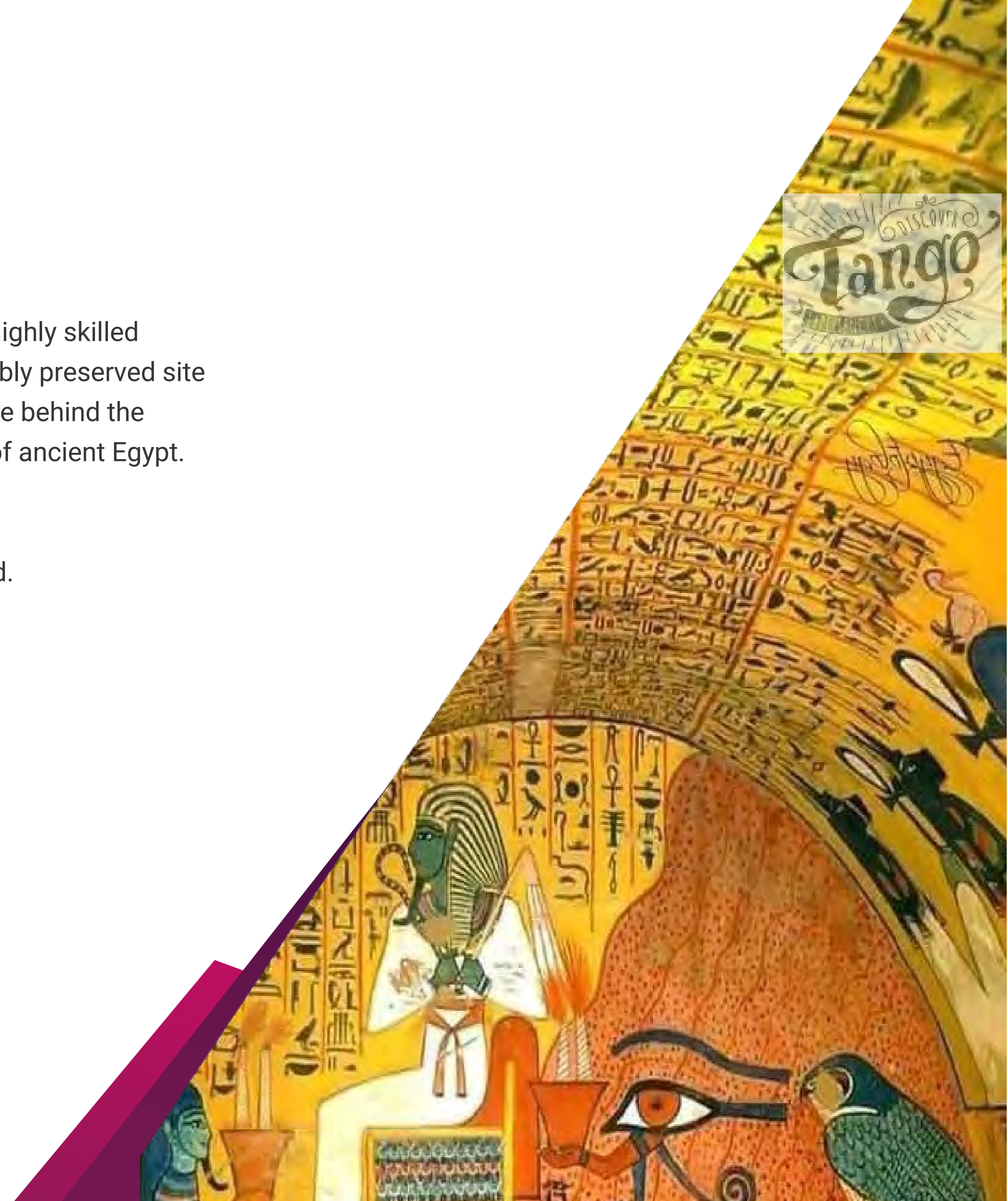
This site offers a unique insight into ancient Egypt's history, art, and beliefs about the afterlife.



Valley of the Workers

The Valley of the Workers, also known as Deir el-Medina, was the village where the highly skilled artisans and craftsmen who built and decorated the royal tombs lived. This remarkably preserved site offers a rare glimpse into the daily lives, beliefs, and social organization of the people behind the masterpieces of the Valley of the Kings, revealing a more human and intimate side of ancient Egypt.

After the visit, we will go for lunch in a local restaurant called Paris .
You will taste regional dishes rich in colors and flavors. Water or soft drinks included.



Queen Hatshepsut Temple

The Temple of Queen Hatshepsut, located at Deir el-Bahari near Luxor, is one of ancient Egypt's most impressive architectural masterpieces. Built into dramatic limestone cliffs, it honors one of Egypt's most powerful female pharaohs and reflects her visionary reign, marked by prosperity, trade, and remarkable artistic achievement. We will also make a short stop at the Colossi of Memnon, the impressive twin statues that have guarded the Theban necropolis for over 3,000 years, giving guests the opportunity to take photos of these iconic monuments before continuing our visit.



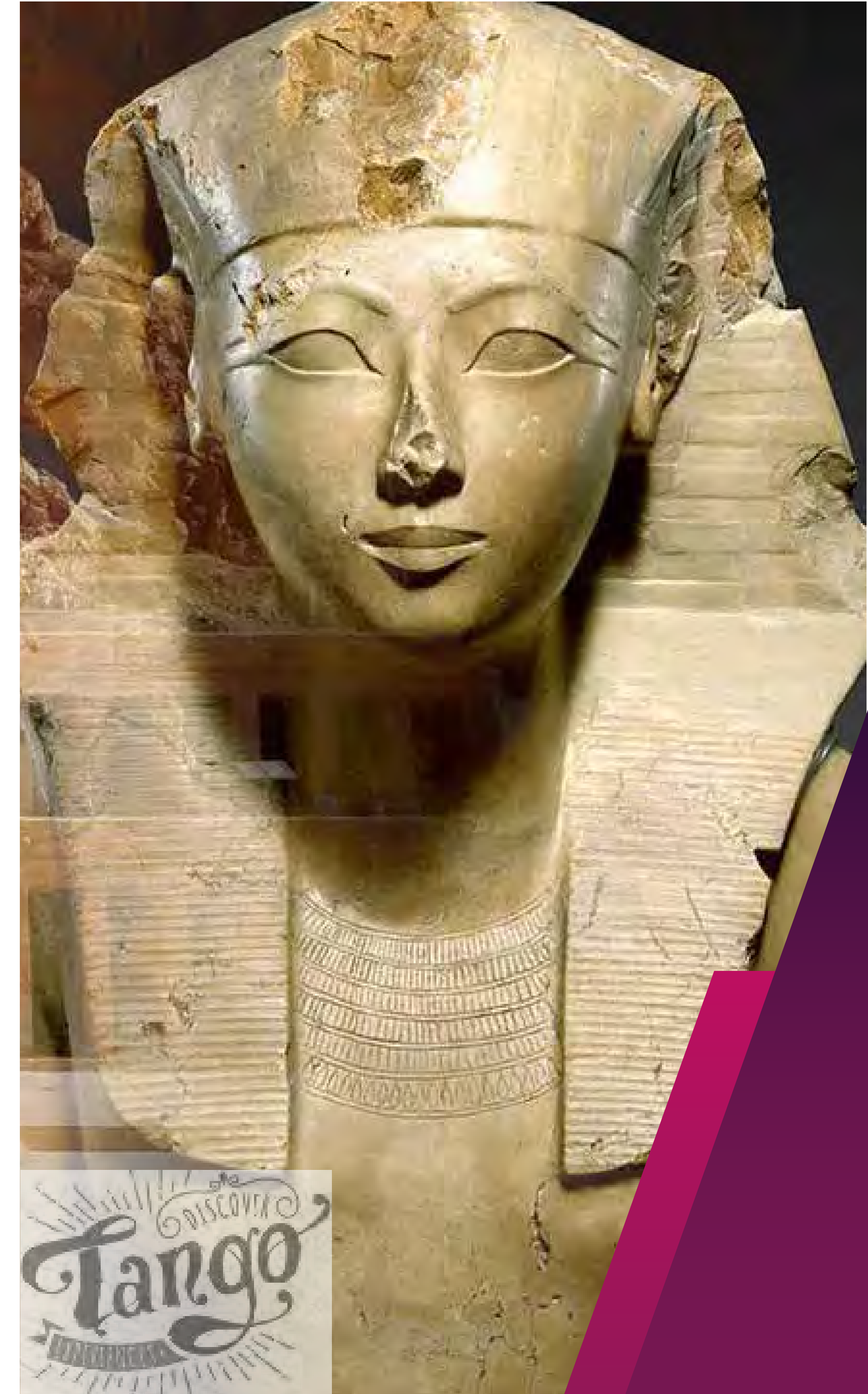
Temple of Queen Hatshepsut

It was built by Queen Hatshepsut, daughter of Thutmose I, who ruled Egypt about 20 years during the 18th Dynasty (approximately from 1490 to 1469 B.C), the only pharaonic woman who reigned ancient Egypt.



Colossi of Memnon

The Colossi of Memnon are two massive stone statues of Pharaoh Amenhotep III. Standing at over 18 meters tall, these monumental statues once flanked the entrance to Amenhotep III's mortuary temple. They are famous for their striking size.



Karnak Temple

The Temple of Karnak, located near Luxor, is the largest religious complex ever built in ancient Egypt. Developed over more than 2,000 years by successive pharaohs, it is a breathtaking open-air sanctuary of colossal columns, sacred lakes, and richly decorated temples, dedicated primarily to the god Amun-Ra.

The vast temple complex features towering obelisks, massive pylons, and intricately carved walls, offering a glimpse into the grandeur of Egypt's New Kingdom. It remains a testament to ancient Egyptian architecture and religious practices.



Hotel in Luxor

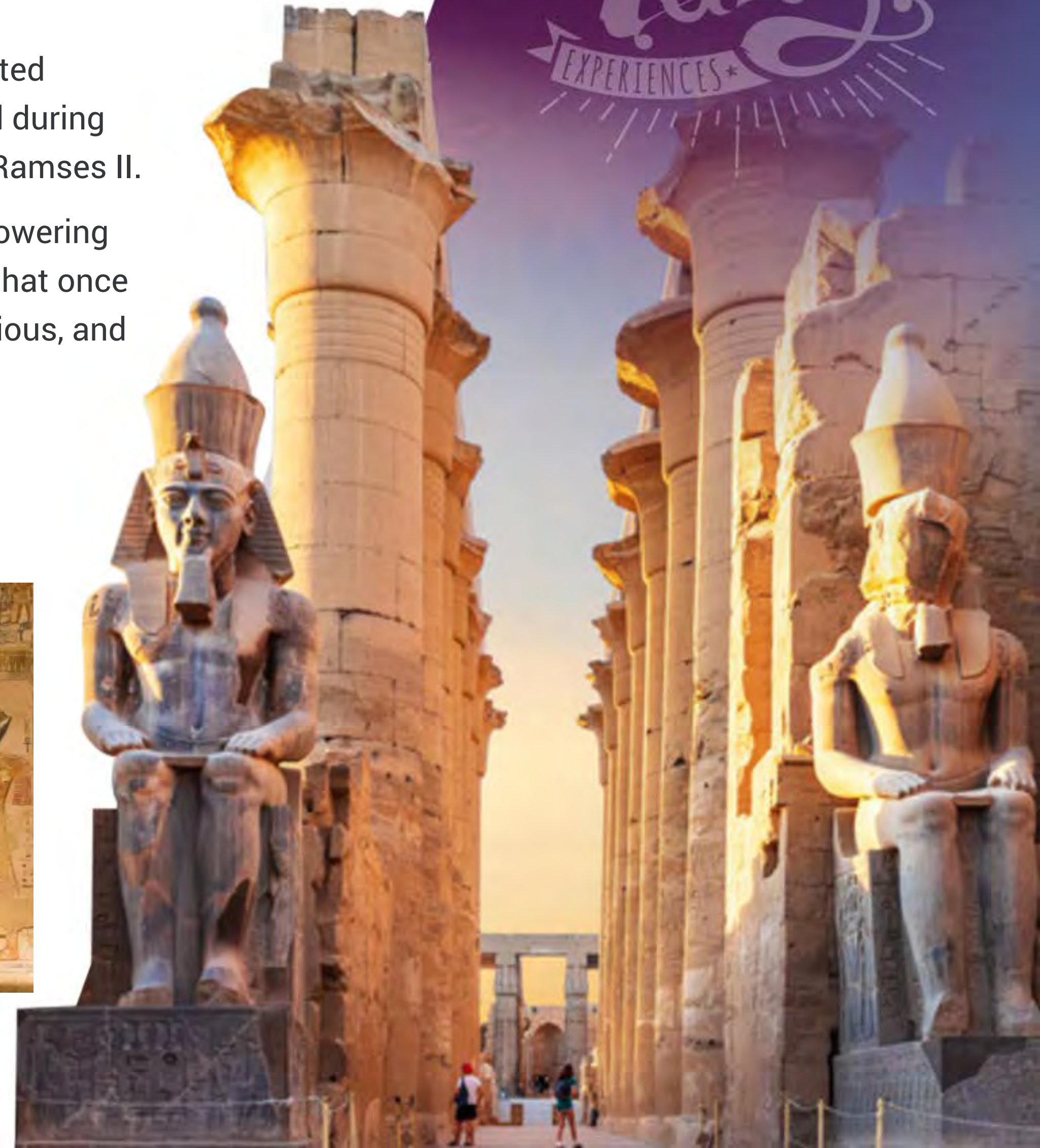
We'll spend one night at Lotus hotel before starting our Nile cruise onboard the dahabiya the next day.



Luxor Temple

Luxor Temple, is one of Egypt's most well-preserved and historically significant temples. Dedicated primarily to the god Amun, along with other deities such as Mut and Khonsu, it was constructed during the New Kingdom, particularly under the reigns of Pharaohs Amenhotep III, Tutankhamun, and Ramses II.

The temple is renowned for its grand entrance, marked by a massive pylon (gateway) and two towering obelisks, one of which was relocated to Paris. The temple also features an avenue of sphinxes that once linked it to Karnak Temple, further enhancing its grandeur. The temple's blend of historical, religious, and architectural significance makes it a must-see for visitors exploring Egypt's ancient heritage.



Nile Palace Dahabiya

The Nile Palace Dahabiya is a luxurious Nile cruise vessel offering an intimate and elegant journey through Egypt's timeless landscapes. This boat will be exclusively reserved for our group, offering a unique and intimate setting for daily tango lessons led by Fernanda and Alejandro. 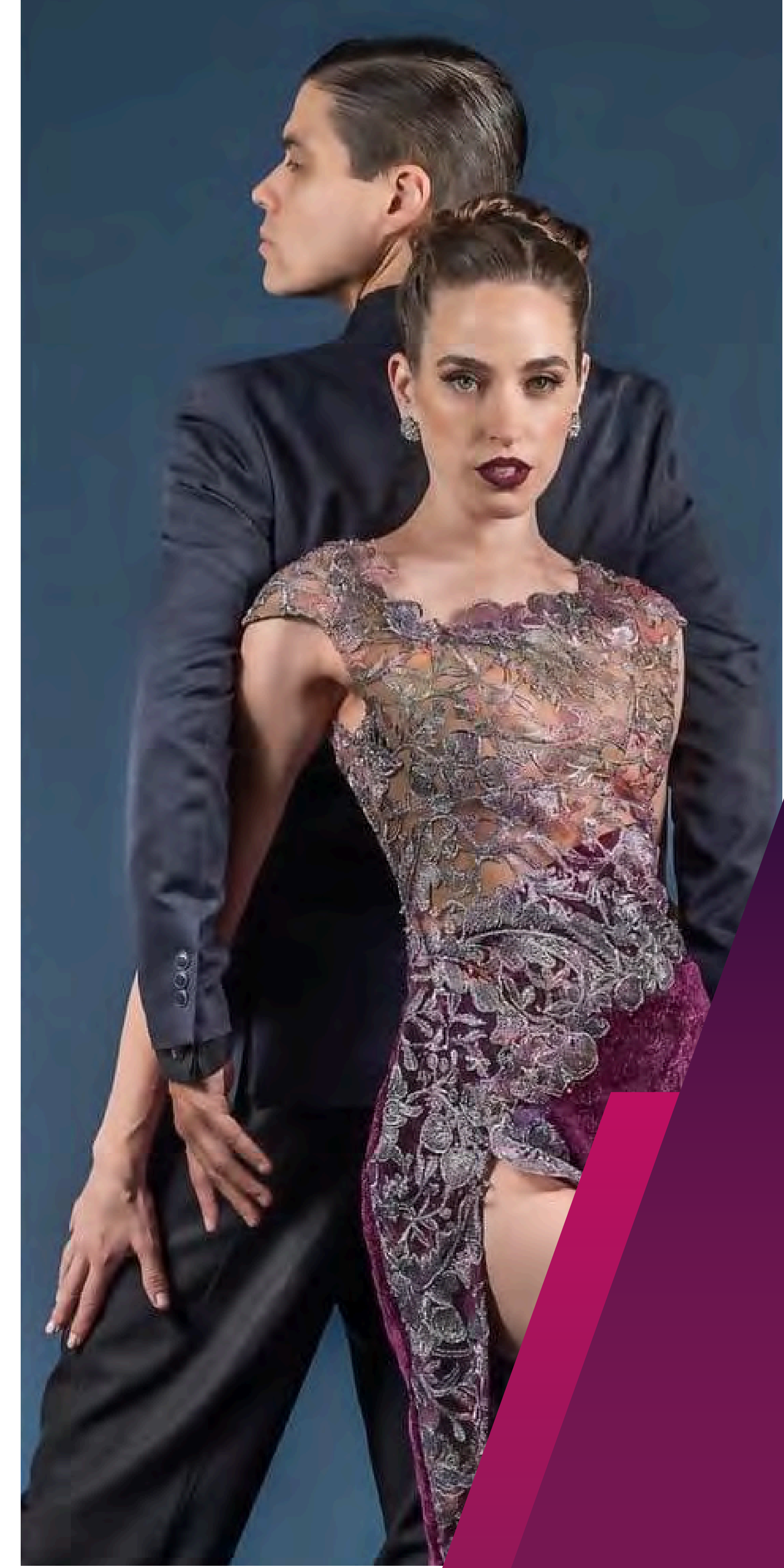
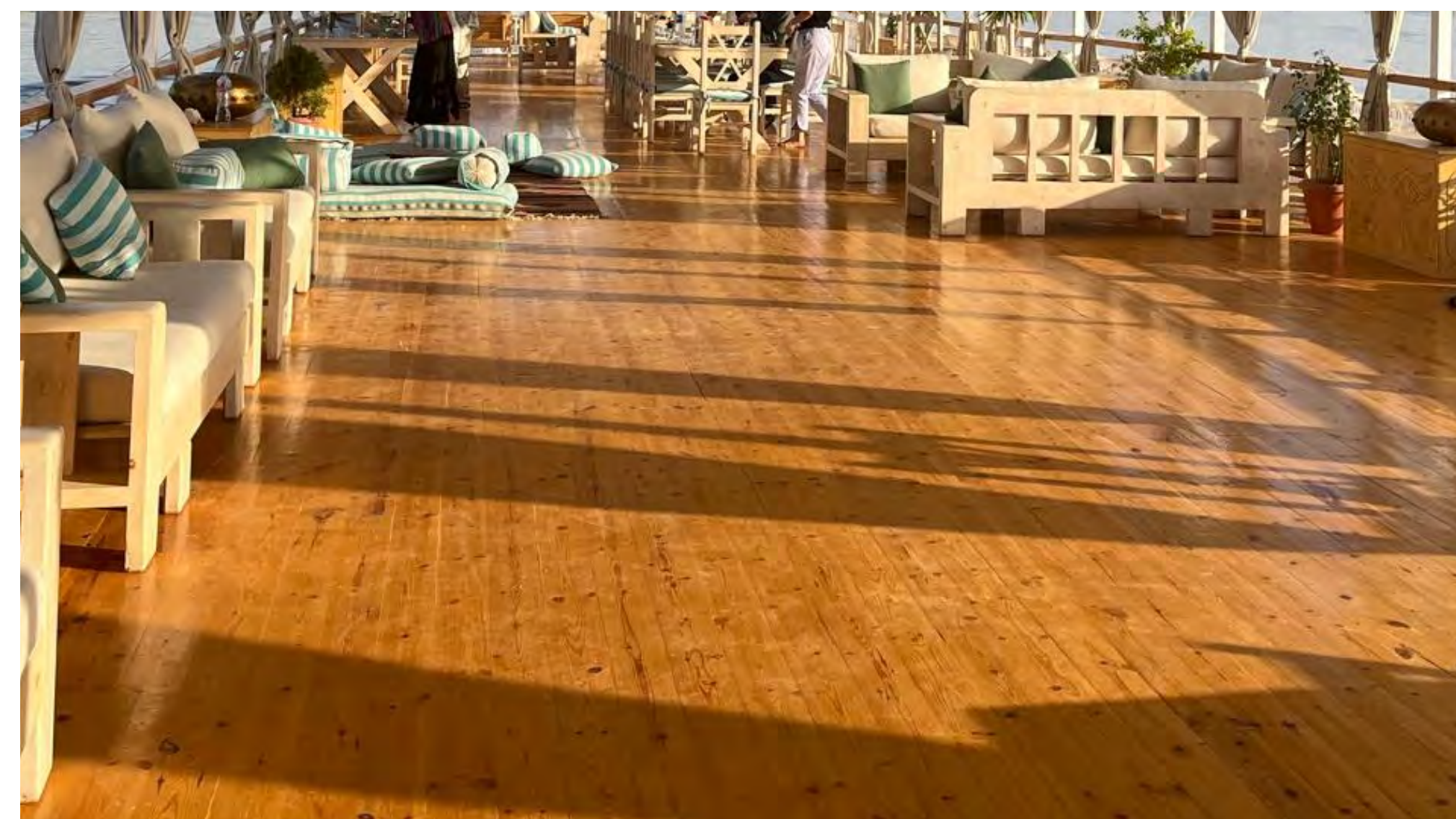


Every day Tango lessons

In short, this journey on the Nile river offers complete freedom: you will have the chance to dance as much as you wish, whether through structured classes, informal dancing, or individual coaching.



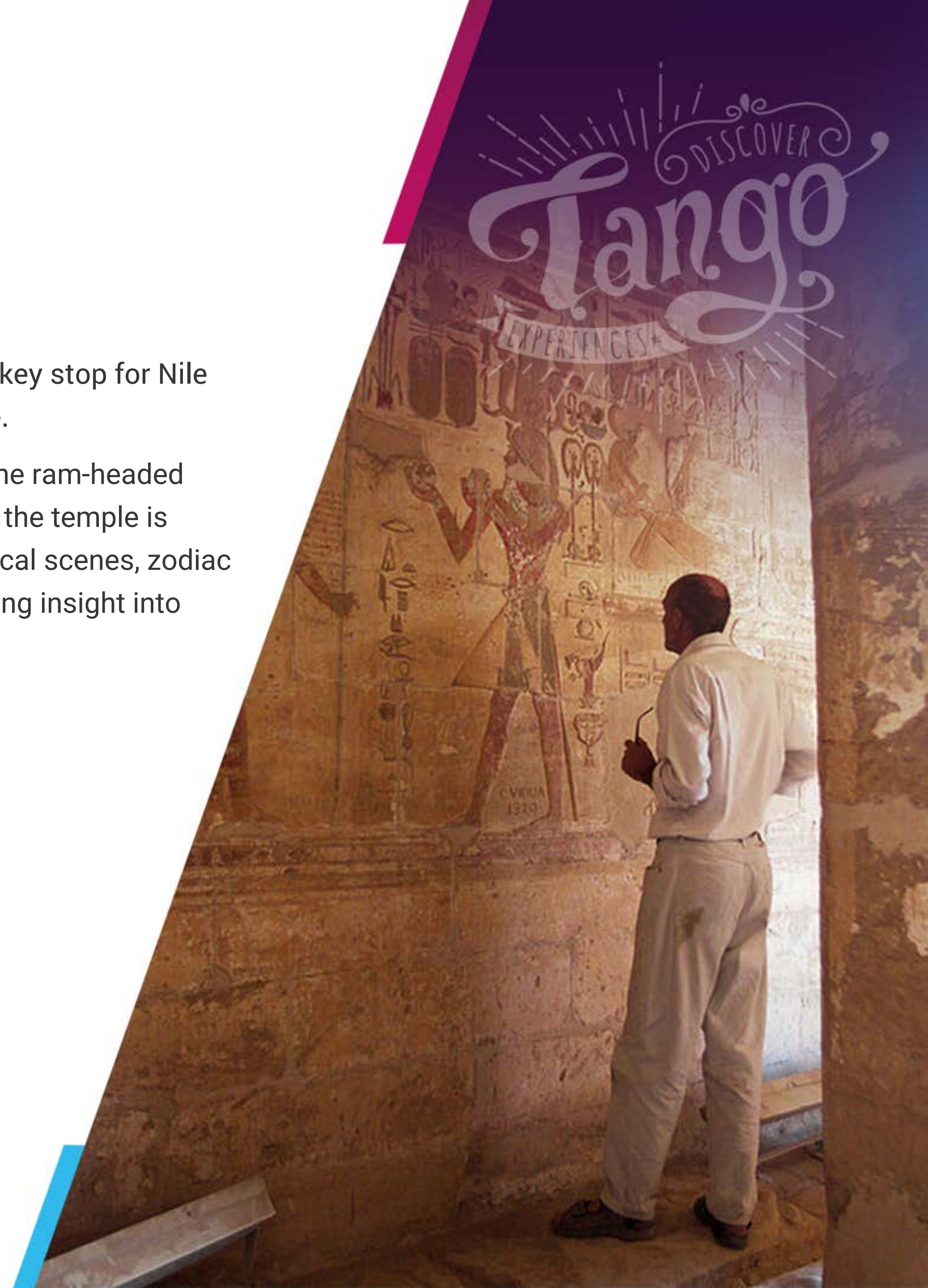
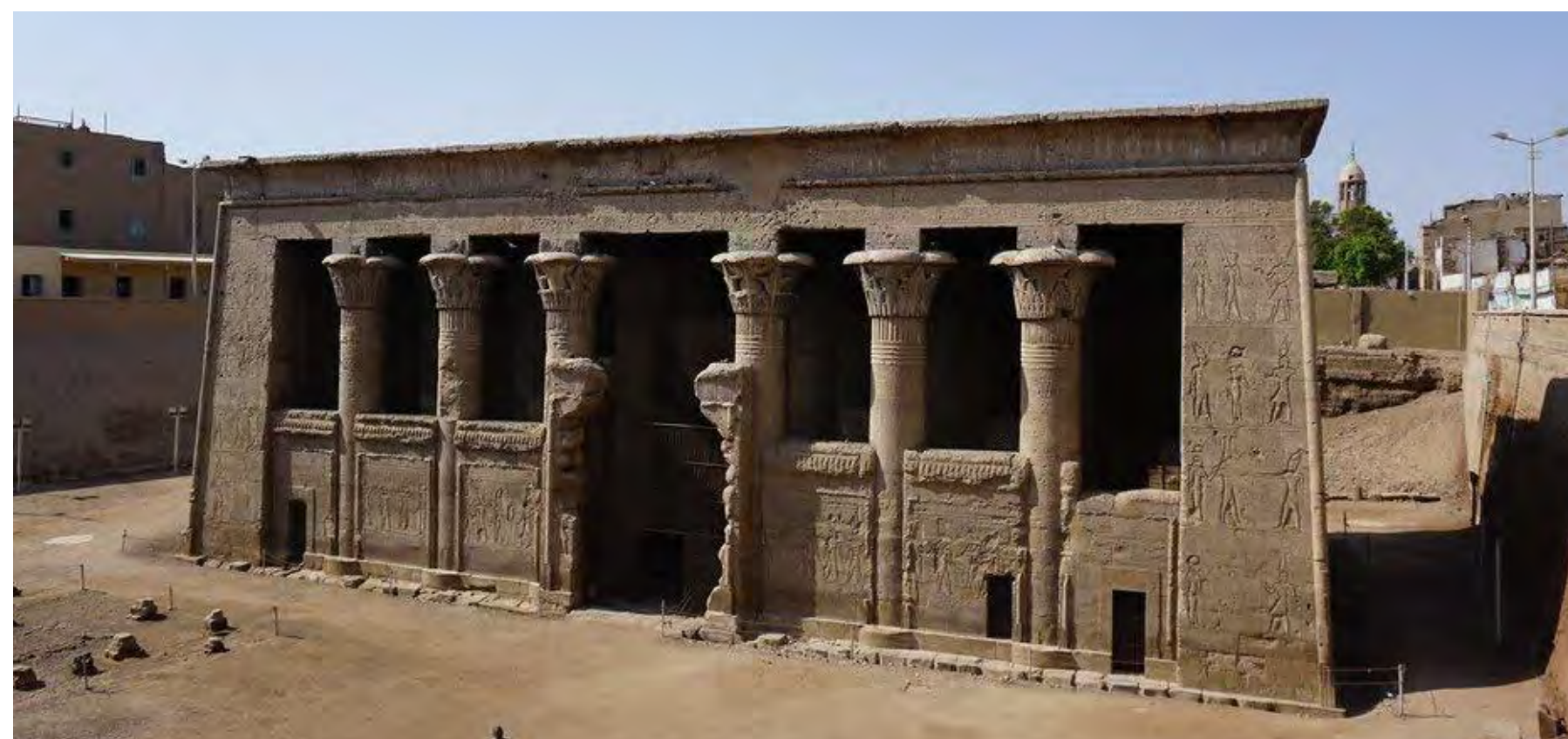
Esna Temple

After this you will be transferred to the Dahabyia and sail to Esna.

Esna is a historic town in southern Egypt, located on the west bank of the Nile River. It's also a key stop for Nile cruises, offering a glimpse into Egypt's ancient heritage and a vibrant local market atmosphere.

The Temple of Esna is a remarkably well-preserved Greco-Roman temple dedicated to Khnum, the ram-headed creator god associated with the Nile and fertility. Built during the Ptolemaic and Roman periods, the temple is especially renowned for its intricately carved and vividly colored ceiling, adorned with astronomical scenes, zodiac signs, and depictions of Egyptian deities. Located below modern street level, it offers a fascinating insight into Egypt's religious continuity and artistic refinement during the later phases of its ancient history.

Overnight and dinner onboard Dahabyia.



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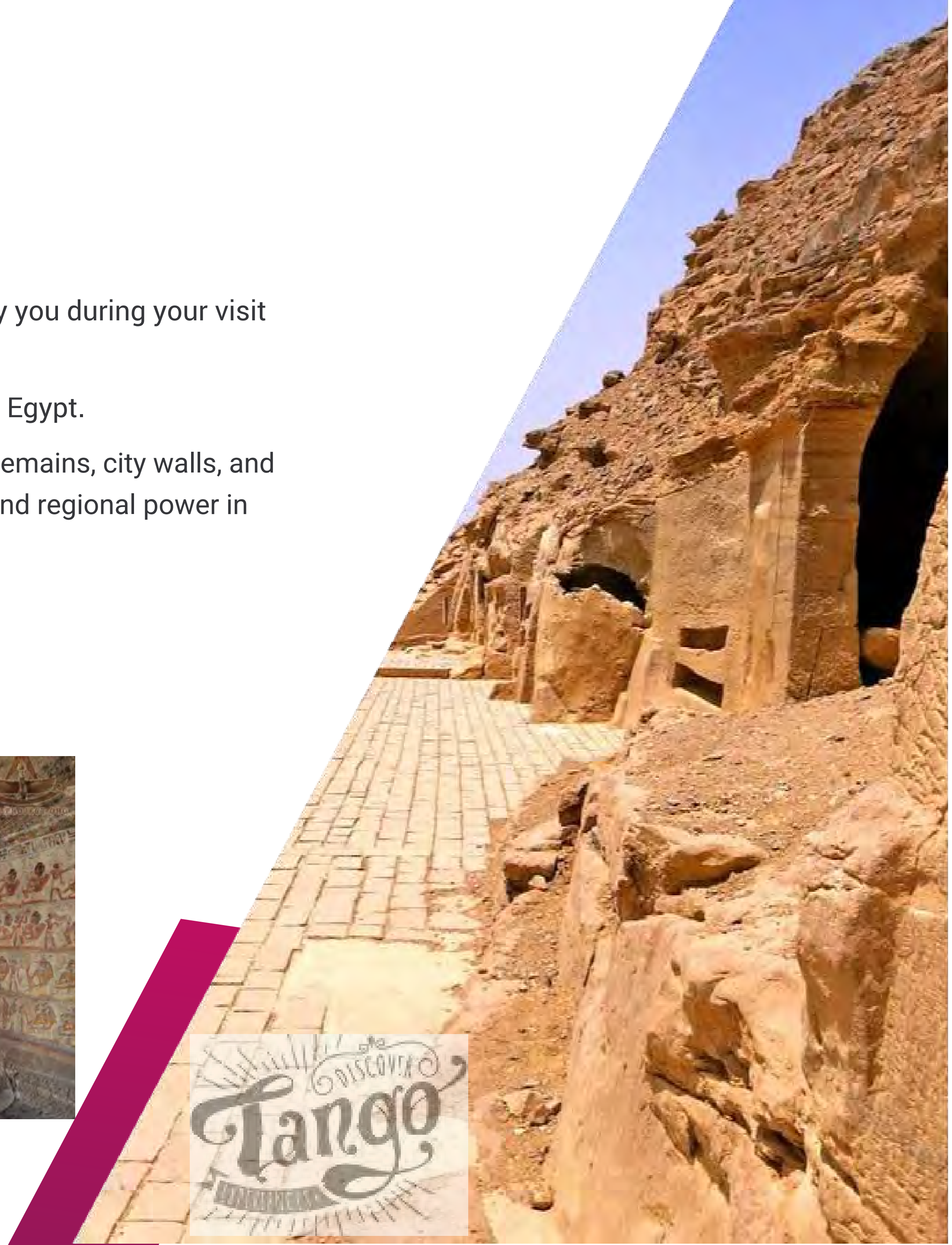
El Kab

After enjoying the breakfast, we set sail to El Kab, where your private guide will accompany you during your visit of the archeological site.

El Kab, located in the ancient town of Nekheb, is an important archaeological site in Upper Egypt.

Once an important religious and administrative center, it is home to well-preserved temple remains, city walls, and rock-cut tombs of local governors, offering a rare and authentic glimpse into everyday life and regional power in ancient Egypt.

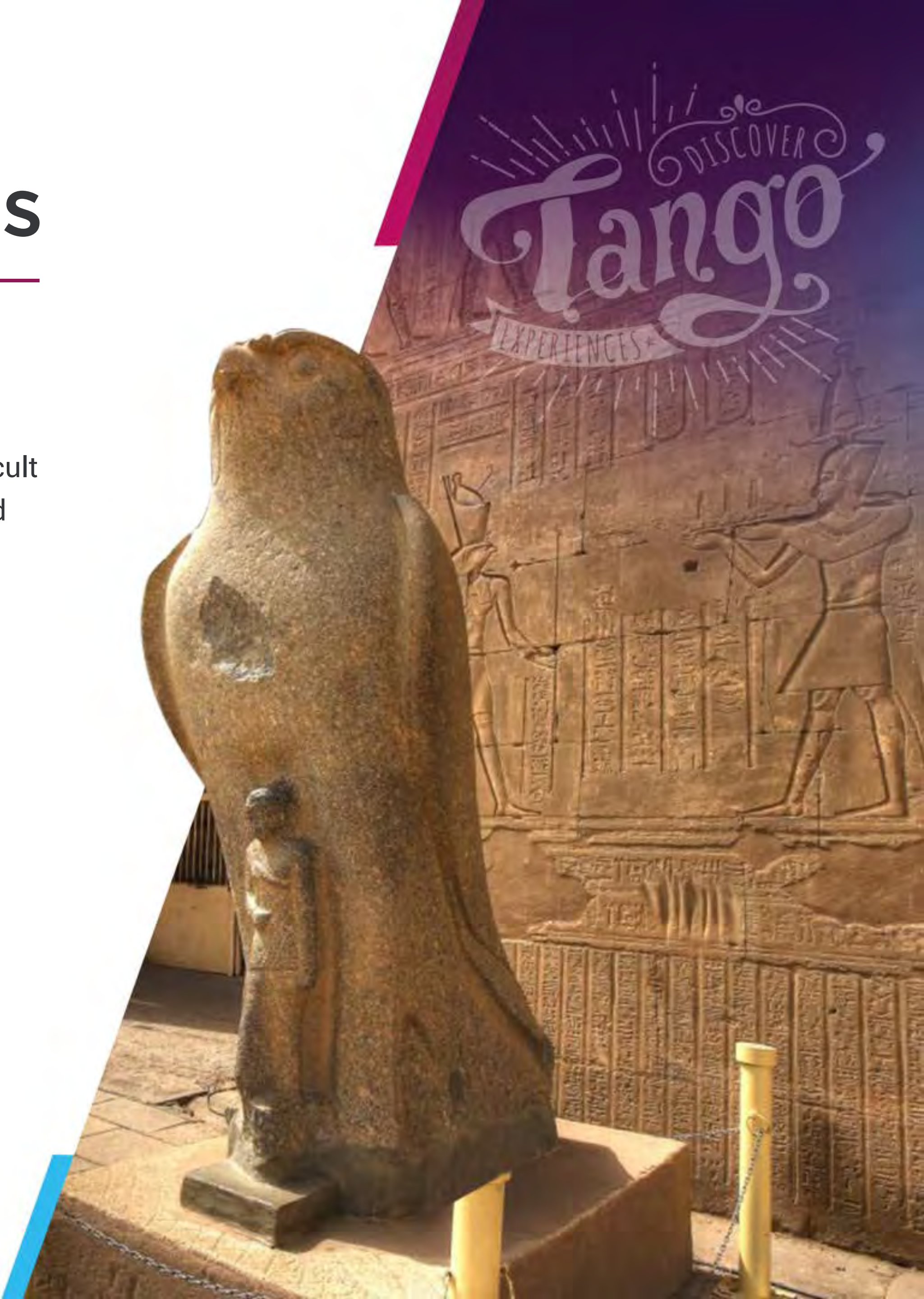
Temple dedicated to two Gods

Edfu Temple

Upon arrival to Edfu your personal guide will accompany you to visit:

The majestic temple dedicated to Horus which is considered by most to be the best-preserved cult temple in Egypt. According to the Egyptian myths, it was the place where the falcon-headed god Horus revenge the murder of his father Osiris by killing Seth.

Gebel el-Silsila

Gebel el-Silsila is an ancient Egyptian quarry site located along the Nile between Edfu and Kom Ombo. Renowned for its sandstone cliffs and carvings, it served as a key source of stone for temples and monuments. Visitors can explore its fascinating inscriptions, shrines, and remnants of ancient activity.



Kom Ombo Temple

Standing on a promontory at a bend in the Nile, where in ancient times sacred crocodiles basked in the sun on the riverbank, is the Temple of Kom Ombo, one of the Nile Valley's most beautifully temple sites. Unique in Egypt, it is dedicated to two gods; the local crocodile god Sobek, and Haroeris (from har-wer), meaning Horus the Elder.

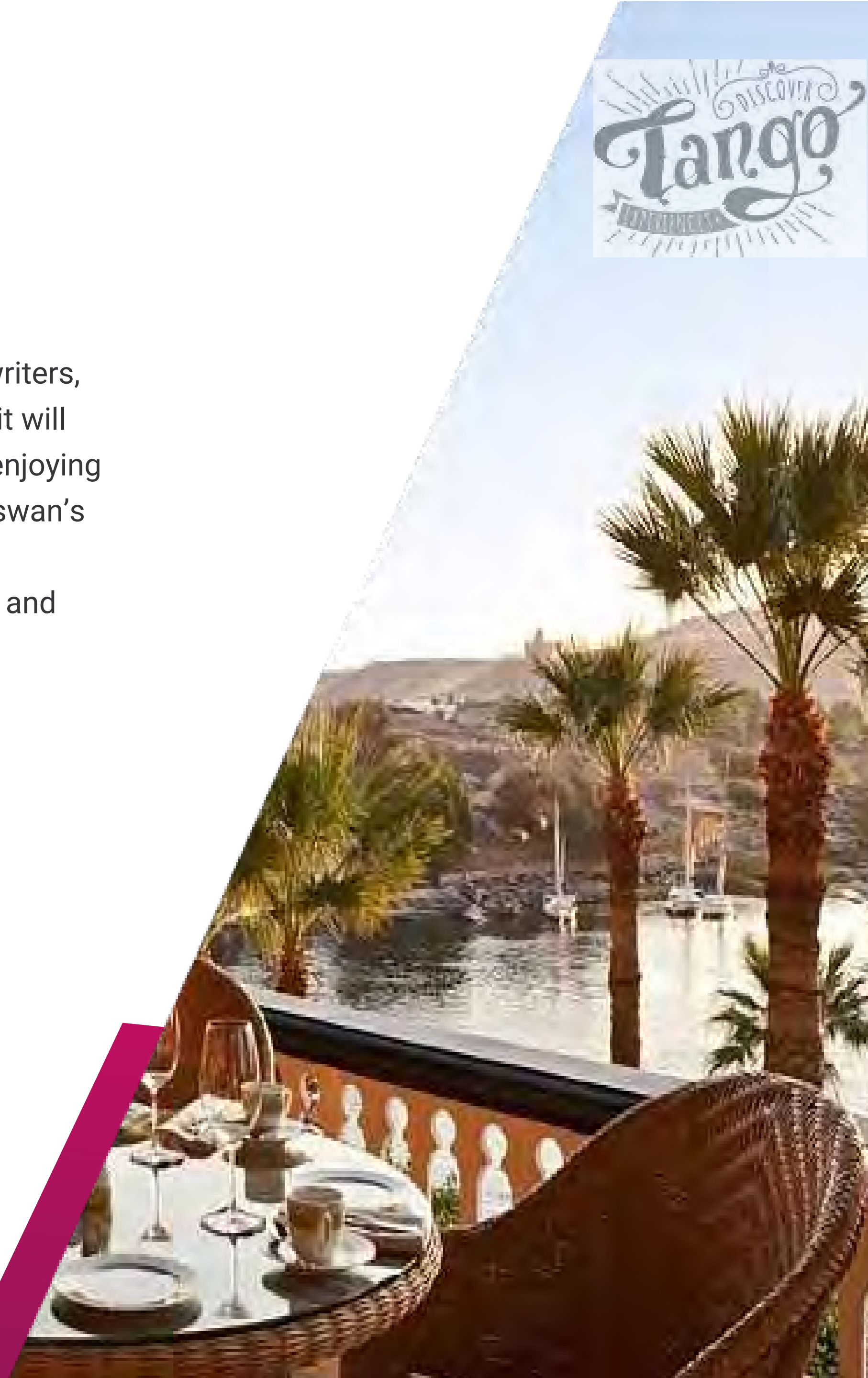

Perched on the banks of the Nile, it blends timeless charm with refined luxury. Our visit will include lunch in its acclaimed Terrace restaurant, where you can relax and savor delicious cuisine while enjoying a breathtaking panoramic view of the river, the gentle movement of feluccas, and the serene beauty of Aswan's waterscape.

This lunch will close an unforgettable trip on the Nile ,where you can still savor last moments of pleasure and tranquility before returning to Cairo.



Philae Temple

The Temple of Philae, located near Aswan, is one of Egypt's most enchanting sanctuaries. Dedicated to the goddess Isis, this beautifully preserved temple complex was rescued from flooding and meticulously relocated to Agilkia Island. Surrounded by the waters of the Nile, Philae's elegant columns, reliefs, and sacred atmosphere make it a deeply moving and magical site to visit.

After our visit, we will head to Aswan airport to catch our flight back to Cairo.

We'll spend the night in Cairo hotel.



Visit of coptic and islamic Cairo

We'll explore with a local guide two historically and culturally rich districts that reflect Egypt's deep religious and architectural heritage.



Al-Rifai Mosque (Masjid Al-Rifa'i)

Situated opposite Sultan Hassan Mosque, this mosque was constructed between 1869 and 1912. It features a tall minaret, ornate domes, and houses the tombs of notable figures, including King Farouk.



Ibn Tulun Mosque

This mosque is famous for its unique spiral minaret, inspired by the Great Mosque of Samarra. It is one of the oldest surviving Islamic landmarks in Cairo, with a vast open space for prayer.

The Hanging Church

Known as the Hanging Church because it is built over the ruins of a Roman fort in Old Cairo. It is located near the Coptic Museum and is one of the oldest and most famous churches in Egypt.



The Church of Abu Serga

This is the oldest church in Egypt, dating back to the 5th century A.D. It is significant as it is built over the crypt where the Holy Family is believed to have stayed for three weeks during their time in Egypt.



Sultan Hassan Mosque

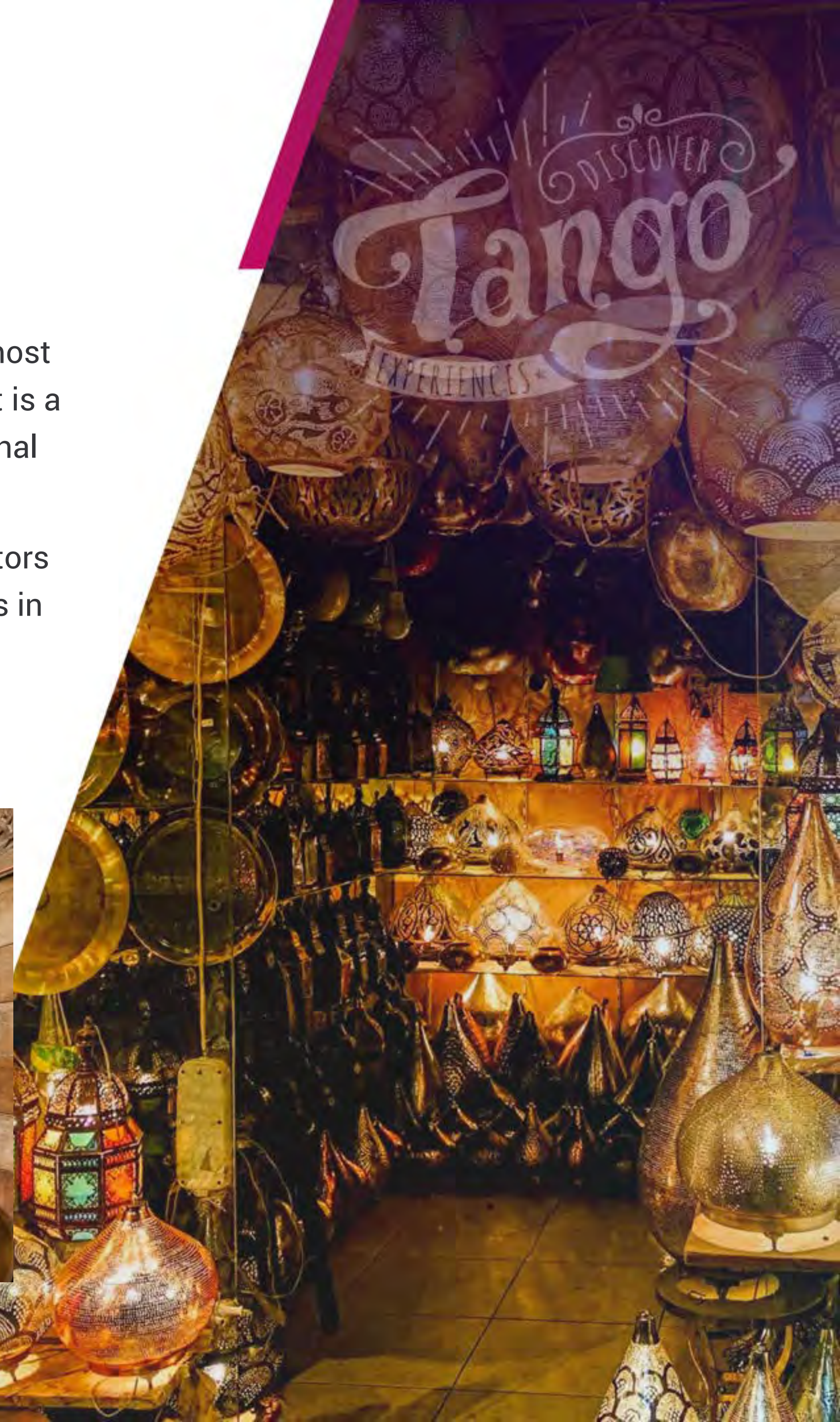
One of the largest mosques in Egypt, built during the Mamluk period (1356-1363). It is renowned for its architectural grandeur and was commissioned by Sultan Hassan, who was known for extravagant expenses.

Khan El Khalili market

Khan El Khalili is a famous bazaar and souk located in the heart of Cairo, Egypt. It is one of the oldest and most vibrant marketplaces in the Middle East, with a history dating back to the 14th century. This bustling market is a labyrinth of narrow, winding alleys lined with shops and stalls that sell a wide variety of goods, from traditional crafts and souvenirs to spices, jewelry, textiles, and more.

Cafés and Restaurants: Scattered throughout Khan El Khalili are numerous cafés and eateries, where visitors can take a break from shopping to enjoy traditional Egyptian food and drinks. One of the most famous cafés in the area is El Fishawi's, known for its historic ambiance and as a meeting place for writers and artists.

All mentioned prices are quoted in Euros.

The prices offered are based on the requested number of participants (10). In the event that we do not reach the minimum of 10 participants, we will proceed to recalculation of the package.

The quotations do not include any insurance for individual travellers or their personal items.

Payments have to be made as per the schedule, failing which; all services/ space will be released after written notice to you.

Any changes to this contract or parts of it are obligatory to be prepared by written notice between both parties.

Payment Policy

Upon confirmation of your itinerary, we will request a deposit of 300 euro per person.

50% of the balance must be paid before 1st June 2026. The final balance will be payable by 15th of September 2026.

Cancellation Policy

If you decide to cancel your stay, please inform us in writing.

The deposit of 300 euros will not be refunded, since it will be used to pay the downpayment for hotels and boat. After the 50% balance has been paid by June 1st, unless you find another person to replace you for this trip, any cancellation will be as follows:

- ▶ Up to 45 days before departure 70% of the payment is refundable (less the deposit of 300 euros).
- ▶ Less than 2 weeks before departure, no refund will apply.
- ▶ No refunds will be applied for cancellation after the start of the trip or for unused services.

Travel insurance is not included in the price of your vacation. Passport & Visa
